5. Where do you feel tempted to rely on effort, discipline, or goodness instead of trusting God's provision?

2. Salvation Required a Substitute

1. According to Exodus 12, what made the difference between life and death that night?
2. How does the blood on the doorposts help us understand the seriousness of sin and judgment?
3. How does Jesus fulfill the role of the Passover lamb?
4. How would you explain to someone the difference between *knowing about* Jesus and *trusting in* His sacrifice?

3. Redeemed People Live Differently

1. After the blood saved them, what immediate changes did God require of Israel?
2. How has your life changed since trusting Christ?
3. In what areas might God be calling you to "leave Egypt" behind?

4. What is one habit, mindset, or attachment that doesn't align with your redeemed identity?
5. What is one intentional step you can take this week to live as someone set free?
